1. **Haden Dixon BEARDSHAW**¹ [155], son of Joseph BEARDSHAW (1847-1901) [230] and Alice Elizabeth HADEN (1850-1910) [231], was born on 5 January 1884 in Sheffield, Yorkshire.¹ On 5 April 1891 he was resident in 66 Osgathorpe Road, Sheffield.² He was educated at The Grammer School in 1901 in Taplow, Buckinghamshire.³ He married Gertrude Peirce DIX on 7 October 1908 in St Andrews Church, Sharrow, Sheffield. He appeared in the census on 2 April 1911 in Sheffield aged 27.⁴ On 2 April 1911 he was a Brass Founder in Sheffield.⁴ On 27 February 1918 he was a Brass Founder at Joseph Beardshaw & Co in Sheffield. He and Gertrude Peirce DIX Moved Home in 1920 to 7 Clifford Road, Sheffield. He died of a severe injury when he was knocked down by lorry after alighting from a tram into the middle of the road.- The Wicker on 6 February 1923 in Sheffield. He was buried in February 1923 in Burngreave Cemetery, Sheffield. He had his estate probated on 15 June 1923 in London. He left effects to the value of £2994 1s to his wife Gertrude.

FUNERAL OF MR. JOSEPH BEARDSHAW

The funeral of Mr Joseph Beardshaw of Osgathorpe, Sheffield, took place yesterday afternoon, at Burngreave Cemetery. Mr. Beardshaw died on Saturday, after a long and painful illness, and the news of his decease was received with great regret. For many years he was a prominent supporter of football – one of those who originally interested themselves in the United Club, and did much to bring that organisation to its present leading position. Other clubs have reason to be grateful for the help he gave them, and he will much missed by all associated with football in Sheffield and district. He was a prominent member of the Pitsmoor Bowling Club, and at various times filled leading offices in

connection with Masonry in Sheffield. He was I.P.M. # of the Royal Brunswick Lodge at the time of his death.

The funeral yesterday was attended by several commercial men, representatives of the United Football Club, Pitsmoor Bowling Green, and Sheffield Masonic Lodges.
